




Q2 How would you describe your gender?




Q3 Are you a season ticket holder for the 21/22 season?





Q4 Are you a debenture holder?





Q5 Are you a member of the Dons Trust?






Q7 The club is exploring the possibility of aiming to become a Certified B

Q8 Are you in favour or opposed to the club becoming a Living Wage Employer?





Q9 The club also works with subcontractors and partners who may not always be Living Wage Employers. Are you in favour or opposed to the club only working with Living Wage Employers?





Q10 When, if at all, do you think the club should become a Living Wage employer?



Q11 Should AFC Wimbledon ever accept sponsorship, of any form, from the following sectors?






Q12 How important do you think it is for AFC Wimbledon to be a community hub?



Q13 How important do you think it is for AFC Wimbledon to be environmentally sustainable?




Q14 How important do you think it is for AFC Wimbledon to embed ourselves in our local communities?








Q18 How important do you think it is for AFC Wimbledon to invest in the future (academies and infrastructure)?



Q19 How important do you think it is for AFC Wimbledon to use our unique history to get funding?




Q20 From the list below, please select up to five values that you think it is most important for AFC Wimbledon to have. You can also suggest other values using the 'Other (please specify)' option.








Q22 Please rank the following criteria based on how important they are in becoming an AFC Wimbledon PLC Board member, where 1 = most important and 4 = least important.






Q25 As noted above, currently the rules state that the Dons Trust maintains more than 75% ownership of AFC Wimbledon PLC voting rights AND that the majority of members of the PLC board must be Dons Trust

Board members. Maintaining more than 75% voting shares gives the Dons

Trust control over any decision made at AFC Wimbledon PLC board meetings.


But there are potential arguments in favour of changing the balance of the PLC Board so that whilst the Dons Trust's voting shares remain at the same level, the Trust is represented on the PLC Board by fewer members. That is, the rules could be changed so that it is not a requirement for the majority of PLC Board members to be Dons Trust

Board members. For example, this could make more space for wider professional expertise without having an overly large Board. Would you be in favour or opposed to relaxing the requirement for the Dons Trust Board to have a majority or directors on the PLC Board, so long as the Dons Trust maintained its current level of voting shares (more than 75%)?




